



STREET SWEEPING **MAY 02/2019**

Being a Bylaw to regulate, restrain the running at large, the licensing and impounding of dogs and overall regulation of animals both domestic and wild within the Village.

"AT LARGE" means off the premises of the owner and not on a leash being controlled by a capable person;

A BIT of HISTORY - Grain Elevators

Melvin Boyd-memories of hauling grain When I first hauled wheat to Big Valley, there was no elevator. We had to shovel the grain into a shed. I can't remember just where that shed was located, I think, somewhere north of the station, by the railroad tracks. Later the Home Grain Co. built an elevator. Fred Stokes was the operator. One day I was late getting in to town with a load of wheat, it was dark and I got stuck on the railroad track with a steel shod sleigh. I could see the lights of a train coming from the north. The freight train was slowing down for the station, and seen me in time to stop. The crew gave the

Home Grain Elevator was built in 1915 in Big Valley. In 1917 Fred Stokes was the agent. The last agent was Mr. Lanhurst who remained there until 1924 when it was torn down and moved to Byemoor. (As We Remember Big Valley, 1974)

sleigh a shove and I was able to go on into town

with my load of wheat with a sigh of relief.

1925: A gang of men has been busy during the past week tearing down the Home elevator at Big Valley. The lumber will be shipped to a point on the Hanna-Warden line and the building reconstructed for the handling of grain this season. It is just ten years ago to the month since the elevator was erected here and F. C. Stokes was the buyer of the first grain to be stored in it. (Big Valley Journal, August 19, 1925).

Parrish and Heimbecker Ltd

It was built around 1919 and Mr. A. V. Cousins was the first agent. In the late 60's or early 70's a feed mill was built beside it. Pete Swainston was the last agent who ran it until it was torn down in February of 1983. Harlen Turville tore it down and built a house with the lumber.




